


BYLAW #11/03

A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS FOR THE PURPOSE OF BURNING WITHIN THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY PURSUANT TO SECTION 7 (1) (d) OF THE PRAIRIE AND FOREST FIRES ACTS.


The Council of the Rural Municipality of Meadow Lake #588, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. No burning of any material shall be allowed within the boundaries of the Municipality without the prior obtainment of burning permit issued in the form marked as Exhibit "A" to this bylaw.
2. The permit shall be issued from the Rural Municipal Office and may be obtained free of charge.
3. Any person found guilty of an infraction of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties imposed by Section 26 of The Prairie and Forest Fires Act.
4. Bylaw #5/02 is hereby repealed.


